Identifying your Leadership Team

- 1. You can't do it alone...make a list of friends on the street and ask them to help contact your neighbors.
- 2. If no friends live on your block, are there parents of children your kids play with or go to school with?
- 3. Take a walk, talk informally with the neighbors about their concerns regarding the neighborhood.
- 4. Through these contacts/ pave the way for developing a leadership team of four or five people to assist you.
- 5. Invite the leadership team to your home to help with plans and arrangements for a meeting with everyone in the block club area.
 - a. Discuss conditions in your block and neighborhood that might threaten your good surroundings.
 - b. Decide whether you want to work together to organize a block club to improve these conditions.
 - c. Decide the boundaries of the proposed organization.
 - d. Set a time and place for a meeting of <u>all</u> the residents within the proposed boundaries to be held in a home, school, church or hall.
 - e. Agree on a plan for inviting everyone to the meeting.
