

# 2017 Veggie Box Information Packet

The Veggie Box program provides a convenient way of obtaining fresh, high quality, locally grown and produced foods. Our goal is to ease the amount of effort involved with healthy conscious eating by bringing the farmer's bounty to you. Each week, we purchase the best in-season produce from an array of local farmers, pack it into a box, and deliver directly to your workplace, or have it available for pick-up at the Allen Market Place. We source our products from local growers and producers in Mid-Michigan who utilize sustainable growing practices and stringent food safety measures. Therefore, we can ensure a safe and healthy product for you and your family that is also good for the environment! Each box includes a newsletter with healthy recipes utilizing that week's produce, a bio of the farmers providing the various items, and preparation tips for featured vegetables.

# Summer Veggie Box & Add-On Items run for 20 weeks, June 15 - October 26.

Summer Veggie Box costs \$400 (add-on items available for an additional cost).

Summer Veggie Box includes a seasonal assortment of fresh, locally grown vegetables & fruits.

Projected items include: asparagus, cooking greens, salad mix, lettuce, peas, radish, okra, herbs, beets, carrots, cabbage, green beans, peppers, kohlrabi, tomatoes, summer squash, cucumbers, sweet corn, onions, winter squash, potatoes, garlic, rhubarb, strawberries, raspberries, apples, peaches, & more.

\*Some crops may be unavailable due to adverse weather conditions or other factors outside of our control.

### Fall Veggie Box & Add-On Items run for 8 weeks, November 2 - December 21.

Fall Veggie Box costs \$160 (add-on items available for an additional cost).

Fall Veggie Box includes a seasonal assortment of fresh, locally grown vegetables & fruits.

Projected items include: onions, potatoes, winter squash, kale, collards, Swiss chard, salad mix, lettuce, garlic, apples, cabbage, carrots, beets, turnips, herbs, & more.

\*Some crops may be unavailable due to adverse weather conditions or other factors outside of our control.

#### Add-On Items

In addition to fresh, local produce, we also offer optional locally produced add-on items to further increase the diversity of your box. You can select multiple shares of each add-on item. See the attached payment worksheet for details!

### Schedule, Cost & Payment

The **Summer Veggie Box** program and Add-On Items will run for a twenty week session, **June 15 –October 26**. Summer Veggie Box costs \$400, plus the cost of Summer Add-On Items. *Full payment for add-on items is due no later than May 25, 2017, payable by check and credit only.* 

The **Fall Veggie Box** program and Add-On Items will run for an eight week session, **November 2 – December 21**. Fall Veggie Box costs \$160, plus the cost of Fall Add-On Items. *Full payment for add-on items is due no later than October 12, 2017, payable by check and credit only.* 

#### There are three payment options for Veggie Box:

- 1. Lump Sum- Pay your whole balance at the start of the program by check or credit no later than **May 25, 2017** for Summer Veggie Box and **October 12, 2017** for Fall Veggie Box.
- 2. Split Lump Sum- Pay your balance in two installments.
  - **a.** Summer season first payment of \$200 is due no later than **May 25, 2017**. The remaining balance of \$200 is due no later than **July 20, 2017**. Due to the ordering procedure for add-ons, full payment for Summer Add-Ons is due no later than **May 25, 2017**.

- **b.** Fall season first payment of \$80 is due no later than **October 12, 2017**. The remaining balance of \$80 is due no later than **November 16, 2017**. Due to the ordering procedure for add-ons, full payment for Fall Add-Ons is due no later than **October 12, 2017**.
- 3. Weekly SNAP Payments- Available for SNAP payments only. Pay at the point of pick-up for your share. This payment option is only available to individuals who pick-up their Veggie Box at the Allen Market Place on Thursdays 12-6pm and pay with SNAP. A \$40 deposit (payable by check or credit) is due no later than May 25, 2017 for Summer Veggie Box, and October 12, 2017 for Fall Veggie Box. The \$40 deposit will be forfeited if you drop out mid-season; otherwise deposit will be applied to the final weeks of the Veggie Box season. Weekly SNAP payments are not accepted for add-on items; the full cost of the add-ons is due with the deposit. You are responsible for paying for each share, even if you miss a pick up. SNAP can only be accepted at point-of-sale (not in advance or after).

# **Important Information**

- You are responsible for paying for each share, even if you miss a pick-up.
- We accept payment by check or credit card (Visa & MasterCard by phone).
- Checks made payable to: Allen Neighborhood Center (Veggie Box in the memo line) and can be dropped off or mailed to 1611 E. Kalamazoo St. Lansing, MI 48912
- Check bounce fee is \$12.00
- If you pay via lump sum or split lump sum and drop out mid-season, we will refund your balance less \$40 (cost of two weeks of Veggie Box). There is no refund for add-ons.

# **Delivery & Pick-Up**

We will deliver your freshly packed Veggie Box to your workplace on **Thursdays between 3pm-5pm** (we ask for a minimum of five Veggie Box orders per workplace in order to make a delivery) or you may pick up at the Allen Market Place on **Thursdays between 12pm-6pm.** Produce will be packaged in a reusable box labeled with your name. Temperature controlled items (meats, eggs, cheese) will be placed in a cooler or refrigerator, depending on the resources available at your workplace. **Empty boxes must be returned to your delivery/pickup site each week by delivery time so they may be picked up and reused.** Reusing boxes ensures a low environmental impact and helps us to minimize program costs.

\* The Allen Market Place does not provide make-up deliveries or pick-ups. We recommend you coordinate with a co-worker or friends who will pick-up your box in the case of your absence.
